Role Purpose

Results advocates mobilise to engage decision-makers, amplifying awareness of proven, cost-effective solutions to advance global health and tackle extreme poverty worldwide. At Results, Volunteer Advocates use their voice to generate the political will to end poverty and call for action from the Australian Government. This year, our advocacy focus is on immunisation equity.

As a Campaigner for the Voices for Vaccines campaign you will play a key role calling for Australia to make a generous pledge to Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance in early 2025. We're using our voices to reach the government, the media and the community, calling for Australia to commit to a world where everyone has access to safe and effective vaccines.

Our Gavi campaign aims to ensure that every child has access to life-saving vaccines. Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, plays a crucial role in vaccinating over half of the world's children against deadly diseases. By advocating for Gavi and vaccine equity, we aim to bridge the gap between rich and poor countries, ensuring that every child can receive life-saving immunisations.

Every 4 years, Gavi comes to its donors, including Australia, asking for a renewed pledge of funding to continue their lifesaving programs. This year, we're helping Gavi to make their case. We're using our voices to build the political will to end poverty, and achieve vaccine equity in our region.
