
PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Experience: Participate in first-hand experiences, including parliamentary sitting weeks and caucus engagements.

Engage: Collaborate with stakeholders such as parliamentary friendship groups, NGOs, and policymakers.

Empower: Build a network of future leaders dedicated to Australia's vision as a good global citizen.



2025 FELLOWSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- Guided tour of Parliament House during sitting week.
- Meeting with a member or co-chair of the Australian TB Caucus Parliamentary Friends Group, and a Q&A on the role of parliamentary friendship groups in global health.
- Workshops on global health policy and leadership, with a focus on infectious diseases.
- Networking dinner with MPs, TB Caucus members, global health experts, and Canberrabased advocates.

This fully-funded fellowship offers a unique opportunity to build expertise in advocacy, policy-making, and government processes. As part of Results Australia's mission, fellows commit to:

- Actively participating in our advocacy and policy network upon completing the fellowship.
- Championing key global health initiatives within Results Australia's focus areas.
- Engaging in quarterly policy-driven actions aimed at influencing parliamentary decision-makers.
- Contributing to policy briefs, campaigns, and submissions.
- Mentoring future fellowship cohorts.
- Participating in parliamentary engagement, policy discussions, and advocacy events to support Results Australia's mission.

Participation Requirements: Fellows must attend at least 80% of the program to successfully complete the fellowship.

This fellowship is ideal for those aspiring to leadership roles in public service, policy-making, or politics.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Be at least 18 years of age, an Australian citizen, and enrolled to vote.
- Have plans to live in Australia from March 2025 to October 2025.
- Have a strong interest in Politics.
- Be able to commit to around 8–10 hours a month, noting that some months will be busier than others.
- Hold a bachelor's degree in public health, international development, political science, or related fields, or equivalent practical experience.
- Demonstrate a strong interest in health policy, parliamentary processes, and global health equity.
- Show commitment to improving health outcomes in the Indo-Pacific region through sustained advocacy.
- Possess excellent analytical and communication skills, such as policy analysis, report writing, or public speaking.
- Bring diverse perspectives, such as cultural, professional, or lived experiences, to global health challenges.
- Demonstrate adaptability, teamwork, and a willingness to engage in collaborative advocacy efforts.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I have to be an existing Results Advocate to apply for the Fellowship program?

No, you don't need to be an existing Results Advocate to apply, as long as you meet the eligibility criteria outlined above. However, we strongly encourage all current Results Advocates to apply. The Fellowship Program is a fantastic opportunity to deepen your understanding in global health and enhance your leadership skills.

How will these skills and knowledge be helpful for my future career?

Advocacy skills are valuable across many careers. This year's Fellowship is designed for leaders and change makers, helping you develop communication and influence skills for roles in policy, campaigning, community organising, and beyond. Fellows from Results programs have pursued careers with the World Bank, in research, consulting, government, and NGOs.

How much does this Fellowship cost?

Results will cover all program costs, including food, transport, and accommodation for any required travel during the Fellowship. We'll also cover conference registration fees and expenses for trainers and experts.

Do I need any experience to participate in the Fellowship?

Yes, you need a bachelor's degree in public health, international development, political science, or a related field, or equivalent practical experience. The Fellowship supports those passionate about global health equity and advocacy.

What does the application process involve?

The application process involves completing an online form, where you'll be asked to share your experience, future goals, and how you like to learn and work with others. If shortlisted, you'll be invited to a Zoom interview in January.

How do I apply?

Apply online via. Applications will be assessed on a rolling basis and close at midnight AEDT on 15 January 2025.
